
The Amsterdam Declaration in Support of a Fully Sustainable Palm Oil Supply Chain by 2020 signed on 7 December 2015 in Amsterdam



Next steps in implementing The Amsterdam Declaration

Deepening

- Policy options: explore which instruments and interventions should be applied at national and EU
- Organized first annual multi stakeholder meeting in June this year with all governments, companies and NGOs to discuss policy options
- Formulate joint positions by governments of signatory countries.

Widening

- Expanding the number of signatory countries through diplomatic channels.
- Share the ESPO story during inter-governmental meetings.
